





The 138 new participants registered at the Community Centre are from:





Update on services & events

★ Diapers distribution



Be Aware And Share started cooperating with Carry The Future (CtF) in 2022. After communicating the numbers of pieces and sizes needed, CtF redirects the order to a local company - Oikon Diapers -, who deliver to the Centre. This January, a new grant agreement was signed with CtF for the year 2024. This grant allows us to support approximately 65 babies on a weekly basis. The need for diapers is very high and keeps on increasing as the

number of new registered participants at the Centre including children (0-3 years old) remains high.



★ The Free Clothes Shop

January was a very busy month in the Free Clothes Shop. 757 participants visited the Clothes shop to choose their 4 monthly items. We received three big deliveries in the middle of December from Attika warehouse, IHA and from REFY & Sonnenhaus from Switzerland. The shop was then fully restocked with winter clothing.



★ The Community Kitchen

Halimah, our newest community volunteer, started with us this month. She has taken on a lot of responsibility in the Community Kitchen, organising and cooking delicious meals four days per week!



★ Education

After the holidays break, the English classes resumed at the Community Centre with teacher Nikos, twice a week for different levels of English. This month we had more requests for Greek classes. Nikos plans to start a Greek beginners class in February.

★ Kids space

The kids room is a very busy area with 20 children of all ages on average everyday. Board games, paint, instruments and different crafts material are available in this room.

The scouts of Ioannina have a "Wall of Kindness" project ("Toíxo $K\alpha\lambda\sigma\sigma\acute{u}v\eta\varsigma$ "), in which they will place colourful wooden boards all over the city, where people can leave essential items for others to take. Together with the children, some of the scout members painted one of these boards at the Centre.

Context & new development

Positive New Three-Year Residency Permit Law

A new law passed in December 2023 means that if people can prove they have lived in Greece for three or more years before 30 November 2023, without a residency permit can now apply for a three year residency permit.

The system is not yet online, but is expected to be operational by the end of March. People will need to have a job offer declaration from an employer in order to qualify for this scheme. This law will apply until the end of 2024 ¹

Asylum Seekers can now legally work 60 days after applying for asylum

Asylum seekers are now eligible to legally work in Greece 60 days after registering their asylum claim. Previously it was only possible for asylum seekers to legally work 6 months after they made their initial asylum claim. ²

New developments in Agia Eleni camp

Around Agia Eleni camp, an approximately three metre high concrete wall is nearing completion. This is the same 'prison-like' design as already completed around Katsikas camp, pictured below and other camps throughout Greece. There will also be enhanced security including turnstiles at the entrance of Agia Eleni.

- Filippiada shuttle service

The MMA were providing a fixed scheduled bus service to Ioannina on Tuesday and Friday mornings, for people to attend asylum and hospital appointments, for most of this quarter. We were informed in late November that the bus service was to be paused for a few weeks. Yet in January, the bus service was still not running in January. People had to purchase their own ticket, costing about 13.20€ per person for a round trip to Ioannina.
